Like Winslow Homer, one of the 19th century's foremost painters, Vey is inspired by the landscapes, waters, and colors of the region. His canvases are as dazzling as his surroundings and often exude rich floral details, formal architectural patterns, and intricate, almost abstract, flowery geometric forms. For over a quarter-century,

Vey has painted the easy elegance of The Florida Keys — from its secret backcountry nooks, to the proud Victorian architecture, and over 3,000 other historic landmarks around Key West.

Using only an artist's palette knife, Vey lays down explosive colors


that reflect the bright, washed-out light of the islands. His lush vegetation, white sand beaches, breathtaking skies, and local architecture echo the vibrant light of the sun-drenched tropics.

In addition to being a favorite of collectors, Vey's work has graced the covers of innumerable magazines and has been featured in the Netflix series *Bloodline*, as well as in the film *Heart of a Lion*. His paintings have also debuted at the Newseum Museum in Washington, DC. Peter Vey's unique view,

ark your calendars because starting on Saturday, March 1, Key West rolls out the red carpet for a month-long birthday celebration honoring Pulitzer Prizewinning literary icon Tennessee Williams, who resided here for 34 years.

Hosted by the Key West Art & Historical Society, the annual Tennessee Williams Festival pays homage to one of the world's most popular literary giants with a series of art and cultural events staged at various venues around the island.

Events honoring Williams include museum fundraisers, plein air painting competitions, poetry and short story writing contests, academic lectures, museum tours, film screenings, live theater, and a birthday party replete with cake and bubbly.

Born on March 26, 1911, Williams visited and lived in Key West from 1941 until 1983, when he inhaled an eyedropper bottle cap in a freak accident and choked to death.

During his storied life, Williams'



It All Began With a Couple of Clothespins The 60th Annual Key West Art & Craft Festival

ack in 1965, they called Key West's Old Island Days Art Festival the "Clothesline Art Show." It was a small Key West affair intended to raise renovation money for the historic building at 301 Front Street, now the home of the Key West Art Center.

At the time, local artists actually used clothespins to display their works on a fence in front of Key West's old Custom House, so the name was more than apropos.

Competition for inclusion in the funky little fine art show became so fierce that by 1985, festival organizers decided to limit participation to approximately 100 exhibitors.

Now, sixty years later, the Old Island

Days Art Festival and the popular Key West Craft Show have joined forces to become the new Key West Art & Craft Festival. This juried open-air

show is nationally recognized. It includes 150 exhibitors from across the country and Canada vying to showcase their original creations.

In addition to special art demos and hands-on art stations, you'll find everything from watercolors, acrylics, and oils to sculpture, collage, and photography. This year, there's also a massive selection of hand-crafted jewelry, pottery, glass, and

Over the years, the show's popularity continued to grow. So much so that by 1994, the producers were desperate to find a larger venue, as well as a permanent home.







've always wanted to explore the Keys magical underwater world, but truthfully, the thought of snorkeling or diving scares the fins off of me.


That's why I was thrilled to hop aboard the Key Largo Princess - a 75' luxury glass-bottom motor yacht. She swept me off for an eye-popping, two-hour tour of John Pennekamp Coral Reef State Park and the exciting underwater world of

the adjacent Key Largo Marine Sanctuary.

The Marine Sanctuary is home to Molasses Reef, renowned for its clear water, many fish, and numerous boulder corals. Masses of fish ranging from moray eels, parrotfish, turtles,

rays, and even sharks, are all residents of this awe-inspiring underwater world.

It only takes about 45 minutes to get there, giving you plenty of time to kick back with a tropical cocktail in the air-conditioned main cabin or up top on the sundeck.



Once there, you'll be able to observe the coral reef through several large, flat viewing windows which provide a ringside seat to all the underwater action. The Key Largo Princess holds up to 140 passengers, but truthfully, it never felt crowded, and we always seemed to have plenty of elbow room.



TREASURE HUNT TIPS

Looking for treasure? Walk along the high-tide line where the sand is softest and sift through any debris. It may yield a great find.

Wet sand may also expose pirate bounty when the surf recedes after each wave. Hit the beach soon after an ocean storm. Heavy wave action stirs up sediment and at times picks up objects, like coins, which can tumble right onto the beach.

Look for areas with more shell deposits than others. It could indicate where strong currents stir up loose objects and deposit them on the shoreline.







Prep Note:

Be sure to soak the clams in cold water and a teaspoon of salt for 2-3 hours to expel sand and other impurities. To clean the mussels, place them in a bowl and rinse them thoroughly with running water.

Preparation: Place mussels and clams in a pan and add enough water to create steam. Cover with lid. Over medium heat, let the clams and mussels open (about 7-10 minutes). The mussels and clams will have released their juices. Strain this juice and set it aside. Remove most of the clams and mussels



from their shells. Keep a few in their shells for garnish. Set it all aside. In a pan, heat the olive oil. Add the garlic, season with salt and chili flakes.

Sauté for a few seconds. Add the calamari rinas and cherry tomatoes. Cook for 5 minutes Add the white wine and let the alcohol evaporate. Add the shrimp and cook through about 5 minutes.

Add your freshly cooked pasta along with a ladle of the saved clam and mussel juice.






